Dear Parishioners

The scriptures this weekend present us with some dramatic differences of how to approach life with its inherent difficulties, and how to cope with our troubles. In the first reading we encounter Job, who had great success as a patriarch of a large family. He had wealth, good health and a good name. Suddenly, the bottom fell out: he lost his family and his fortune, and his health failed. He is filled with lament. Job's friends exacerbate his situation by trying to find someone to blame for his troubles. In the end, Job finds that God alone supplies him with strength and support.

In the gospel we hear about Peter's mother-in-law who, upon being healed, rises to wait upon Jesus and the others. She recognizes that those whom Jesus touches and heals are invited to become his disciples. The only worthy response to the action of Jesus is to begin to serve others.

Likewise, in the second reading Paul tells us that he is "compelled" to preach the gospel, and that he has the ability to adapt to the needs and circumstances of his listeners in order to make the good news resonate within them. Paul preaches a crucified, not a comfortable Christ. His service of the word inspires us to remain honest and simple.

In our lives, we, like Job and Paul and Peter's mother-in-law, are called to recognize that only in God made manifest in Christ will we find the strength and support we need to successfully navigate the difficulties that life can present. Having been touched by the healing hand of Christ, we are called to a discipleship of service. Our Christian faith should be lived, thus bringing hope to others who are so much in need of hope.

Lent is Coming: In a few short weeks we will begin our annual Lenten observance. This weekend Deacon Tim is outlining some of the parish offerings that could make this year's lent a time of great personal spiritual growth. Our *Awakening Faith* program is a wonderful way to reintroduce someone you know to the practice of their Catholic faith. In past years, we have had a good number of people return to the church because someone like you cared enough to bring them forward. Don't let the idea of reaching out to someone overwhelm you. Most people return to the practice of their faith because someone invited them to do so. Could that someone be you?

Holy Family Appeal: If you wish to participate in the annual Holy Family Parish appeal, you may return your envelope by mail directly to Holy Family, or you may return it in the Sunday offering and we will see that it gets to the proper destination. Your support is appreciated by the 438 students from Resurrection who attend Holy Family Schools. Catholic education is a gift to our community in many ways. A strong community provides options in education.

HEALTH CARE MANDATES

There has been much media coverage about the health care mandates. The federal government's Department of Health and Human Services is insisting that almost every religious organization must pay for sterilization and contraceptive coverage (including abortion-causing drugs) in their health care insurance plans for employees. The Catholic bishops see this as an attack on conscience rights and religious freedom. Other organizations have announced their opposition: the Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities, the Catholic Health Association, Catholic Charities USA, and Catholic Relief Services. MORE ENERGY SAVING STEPS



Stop the cringe-factor when you receive your February energy bill! Last week, the Res Green Team suggested energy-saving purchases such as door sweeps, chimney plugs, and programmable thermostats. Here are more bright ideas:

- A hot water heater blanket costs about \$20, is easy to install and keeps water inside the tank warm. Your water heater won't have to work as hard.
- Be "old school," but oh-so-eco-smart. Line-dry your clothes on a clothesline strung in your garage, even during the winter months. Another option is an indoor drying rack. Even in freezing cold weather, your clothes will dry, albeit a little slower than on a breezy June day.
- Consider a power strip. Although some electronics need continuous power to remember programmed settings, others can be plugged into a power strip with on/off switch.

THE BRIDGES INITIATIVE OUT OF POVERTY
